2018 — By the Numbers

s we welcome the new year, we at LITA would like to take a moment to let you know that 2018 was a banner year for both the organization and the many lonely older adults we serve! Throughout last year, LITA's volunteers touched lives, warmed hearts and created beautiful new friendships with those who otherwise might be alone. Here are some of the years' highlights:

300 gifts were collected, wrapped and distributed to low-income residents who were likely to get very little.

120 older adults had the chance to spend time with students from 9 Marin elementary schools through our Bridging Generations program.

33 active music volunteers and 4 music classes brought joyful sounds to residents through our Bridging Thru Music program.

45 percent increase in the number of LITA volunteers in 2018. More volunteers allow us to better match people for fulfilling friendships.





102 active volunteers visited residents in Marin's facilities, while 12 volunteers worked behind the scenes, including in our office and on LITA's board.

18 4-legged volunteers (aka dogs!) joined their 2-legged owners on pet visits to residents at **14** facilities.

Lastly, **84** percent of LITA's budget came from people like you. LITA would not be ready to start it's **44th** year without the commitment and financial support of our generous community.

Thank you for standing with and supporting LITA as we continue to bring joy, connection and community to older adults.

LITA Set to Launch Innovative Memory Care Buddies Program

n 2019 LITA will launch a pilot for a Memory Care Buddies program, in response to the growing population of older adults with memory losses. The program will train a small group of volunteers to effectively and compassionately connect with residents whose memories are failing.

Following best practices, LITA will utilize meaningful person-centered strategies specific to the volunteer's resident buddy per their interest(s) and capabilities. LITA staff will help the volunteer to adjust activities as the resident's dementia progresses.

The program will also include ongoing support and training for the cohort of volunteers. The training will provide the volunteers with a sense of community and collaboration along with the

experience and knowledge necessary to engage in successful relationships at the residents' levels.

We have not fully funded this pilot, so if you know a person or organization who would like to ensure this happens please connect us.

Bridging Generations Program Mitigates Social Isolation in Older Adults

he Bridging Generations program has been connecting youth and older adults for 10 years. By all accounts participants have greatly enjoyed it.

However in 2018 LITA was able to put some numbers to this success by compiling four years of survey data.

Besides providing an engaging and different sort of social opportunity for the residents, the program dramatically changes how the students view older adults.

There was a 69% increase in the number of students who only use positive words to describe older adults (as opposed to neutral or negative words). These words included:

Nice, Wise Fun, Sweet, Kind, Happy, Cool & Funny.
